What does the fund invest in?


The fund invests primarily in North American securities and may invest in international securities. The fund may also invest in options, warrants, index futures and exchange traded funds.

How risky is it?

The value of your investment can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk Rating

Arrow has rated the volatility of this fund as **medium**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

No guarantees

Like most mutual funds, this fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the money you invest.

How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how Series F units of the fund have performed over the past 10 years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how the fund has performed in each of the past 10 years. The fund dropped in value in one of the 10 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series F units of the fund in a 3-month period over the past 10 years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

Average return

A person who invested \$1,000 in the fund on August 27, 2007 would have \$2,285 on April 30, 2018. This works out to an annual compound return of 8.0%.

Who is this fund for?

Investors who:

- Are looking for a long term investment
- Want to invest in a managed portfolio of North American securities
- Are comfortable with a medium risk level

! This series is not appropriate if you require income from your investment.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund outside a registered plan, fund distributions are included in your income for tax purposes, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested. If you hold your fund inside a registered plan, you will include fund distributions and other amounts you withdraw from your registered plan in your income for tax purposes. Different rules apply for Tax-Free Savings Accounts.

How much does this cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series F units of the fund.

The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

Sales charges

No sales charges apply when you purchase Series F units of the fund.

Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns.

As of December 31, 2017, the fund's expenses were 1.75% of its value. This equals \$17.50 for every \$1,000 invested.

Management expense ratio (MER) This is the total of the fund's management fee, performance fee and operating expenses. Arrow waived some of the fund's expenses. If it had not done so, the MER would have been higher.	1.57%
Trading expense ratio (TER) These are the fund's trading costs.	0.18%

Performance fee

The fund charges an annual performance fee of 20% of the amount by which the fund outperforms its benchmark, the S&P TSX Composite Total Return Index.

More about the trailing commission

There is no trailing commission payable by Arrow in respect of Series F units of the fund.

Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
Investment advisory fee	Series F units of the fund are only available to investors who have a fee-based account with their representative's firm and whose representative's firm has signed an agreement with Arrow. You pay a fee to your representative's firm for investment advice and other services.
Short-term trading fee	2% of the value of units you sell or switch within 90 days of buying them. This fee goes to the fund.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase order within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
